US Army Fort Benning Visit

Members of the EHVP team had the opportunity to visit US Army Fort Benning to get a firsthand feel of combat-related activities and learn more about a soldier's preparatory training and experience on the battlefield. The day's itinerary included a morning commute from Atlanta via an Army UH-60 Blackhawk helicopter, exploring a M1A2 SEP tank, target practice at the firing range with the Army Marksmanship Unit, a conversation with the Army Rangers, and concluded with a meeting and discussion with the Fort Benning Martin Community Hospital mental health clinicians.

The visit helped provide context for the team when it comes to treating soldiers. "I think the biggest thing for me today was being able to be out here and just even get a small glimpse into what these people are coming in, training for, and getting ready to do, is helping me to have a better understanding of where they've been and what they're about to go through," said EHVP Social Worker, Danielle Wray.

Clinical Corner



Our program is known for its innovative research when it comes to treating PTSD, and now our team is working with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to make the treatment more accessible nationwide. In her VA role, EHVP Clinical Director, Dr. Sheila Rauch, works to make PTSD care more accessible. Her latest efforts in the VA have focused on a version of Prolonged Exposure for embedded mental health workers in primary care.

Dr. Rauch leads a program at the VA that trains VA primary care mental health providers so they are better prepared to help patients struggling with PTSD. This new offering will provide a brief version of prolonged exposure therapy to patients during a series of four to eight 30-minute appointments.

“There is still a large population of those with PTSD who do not seek care, so we are working to find ways to provide treatment that is not only effective but can be accessed quickly because this population will most likely not follow through with treatment the first time they reach out,” said Dr. Sheila Rauch.

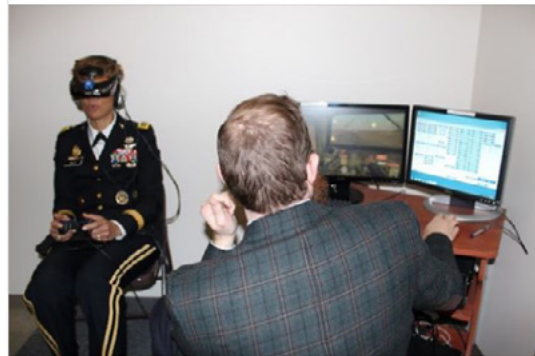
